1. Use Them!

Putting your course in modules helps students locate content with ease. The structure you set gives students a vision of how the material connects and builds from week to week.

2. Add Text Headers

When students view module contents through the Module link, text headers are a good way to delineate information.

3. Use Indents

Using indents adds more structure to the module. While all content is obviously relevant, you can indent to create "sub pages" giving students a quick visual of what is most important.

4. Set Requirements

Setting requirements adds a layer of accountability. Students must complete all or some of the module activities before it is marked complete.

5. Set Prerequisites

Before you can set prerequisites for modules, requirements must be set for prior modules. Prerequisites require students to finish one module before moving to the next.
